Equipment and Software

You will need the Flash player and Adobe Reader installed on your computer. Since this course has an audio narration, you will need computer speakers or headphones. If you are on a slow Internet connection, some pages may take a couple of seconds to load. In this case, it may be faster to click on the title for the next screen in the left navigation bar.

Course Navigation

The course navigation is very simple. The course runs automatically, but you can view or review any page by clicking its title in the list at the left of the screen.

To view a print version of the transcript and additional materials associated with this course, click the Attachments tab at the top of the screen. If you have any trouble opening the files in the attachments section, make sure your popup blocker software is turned off.

Click the transcript button to see a text version of the audio narration.

If you want to jump to a specific screen, click its title on the left side of the screen.
